<u>Moonshot</u> by **Brian Fioca** Simply told, grandly shown in close-up focus and wide-angle visas, this is the flight of Apollo 11 that began on July 16, 1969. DRA 28

<u>Sit-In: How Four Friends Stood Up by Sitting Down</u> by Andrea Davis Pinkney This picture book is a celebration of the 50th anniversary of the momentous Woolworth's lunch counter sit-in, when four college students staged a peaceful protest that became a defining moment in the struggle for racial equality and the growing civil rights movement. Ages 7-10

<u>The Day-Glo Brothers</u> by Chris Barton Brothers Joe and Bob Switzer were quite different. Bob was a hard worker and planner who wanted to grow up to be a doctor. Joe dreamed of making his fortune in show business and loved magic tricks and problem solving. When an accident left Bob recovering in the dark basement, the brothers began experimenting with ultraviolet light and fluorescent paints. Together they stumbled on a formula for colors that glows with an extra-special intensity Day-Glo color. Grades 2-5

<u>Engineers Build Models</u> by Reagan Miller Describes how engineers use models to help them build planes, automobiles, houses, and other structures, and discusses the different kinds of models. DRA 34-38

<u>I, Fly: The Buzz About Flies and How Awesome They Are</u> by **Bridget Heos** For kids who like to be grossed out. Told from the point of view of the fly who is irritated by everyone's fascination with butterflies. Grades 2+

<u>Ice Cream Summer</u> by: <u>Peter Sis</u> Get the scoop on some fun history, math, and new vocabulary in this entertaining book about ice cream. DRA 24

<u>The House That Jane Built: A Story About Jane Addams</u> by <u>Tanya Lee Stone</u> This is the story of Jane Addams, the first American woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize, who transformed a poor neighborhood in Chicago by opening up her house as a community center. Grades 1-2

**Egg: Nature's Perfect Package** by Robin Page Hatching a plan for survival isn't always easy in the wild. And how animals lay, protect, and even use each other's eggs as a food source help reveal the life cycle of the natural world. Grades K-3

<u>Ada Byron Lovelace and the Thinking Machine</u> by <u>Laurie Wallmark</u> Ada Lovelace, the daughter of the famous romantic poet, Lord Byron, develops her creativity through science and math. Grades K-3

<u>How to Code: A Step-by-Step Guide to Computer Coding</u> by <u>Max Wainewright</u> Introduces the basic principles of coding. Learn how to give instructions and turn instructions into code. Figure out how to debug code, solve problems and use algorithms. Grades 2-3

Hello Ruby: Adventures in Coding by Linda Liukas Meet Ruby—a small girl with a huge imagination, and the determination to solve any puzzle. As Ruby stomps around her world making new friends, including the Wise Snow Leopard, the Friendly Foxes, and the Messy Robots, kids will be introduced to the fundamentals of computational thinking, like how to break big problems into small ones, create step-by-step plans, look for patterns and think outside the box through storytelling. Grades K-3

The Doctor with an Eye for Eyes: The Story of Dr. Patricia Bath by Julia Finley Mosca As a girl coming of age during the Civil Rights Movement, Patricia Bath made it her mission to become a doctor. When obstacles like racism, poverty, and sexism threatened this goal, she persevered—brightening the world with a game-changing treatment for blindness! Grades K-5

Why Do Dogs Bark? by Joan Holub There are many different kinds of dogs and so much to find out about them. Why do dogs bark, howl, or bury bones? Why do they like to lick and sniff people? What jobs can dogs do? You'll find the answers to these questions and many more in this fact-filled reader about man's best friend. DRA 20-24

#### Flower Garden by Eve Bunting Illustrated by Kathryn Hewitt

Bring nature into your classroom with this glorious, picture-book celebration of flowers, growth, and possibility — a fiction offering that makes an innovative and yet seamless connection. Ages 6-7 DRA 16

<u>The Snow Leopard</u> by: Jackie Morris This mountain story tells of a boy who dreams and hears a leopard, once human, that "sang the stars to life." When intruders invade their hidden valley, the leopard passes on both his protective song and his animal form to the boy.

<u>The Book of Mistakes</u> by <u>Corinna Luyken</u> As one artist incorporates accidental splotches, spots, and misshapen things into her art. Ages 4-8 Pk-3

<u>Ladybugs</u> by Gail Gibbons Ladybugs are a type of beetle. They live on six of the seven continents. There are believed to be about 5,000 different kinds of ladybugs around the world. Ages 4-8 Grades K-3

<u>Counting in the Garden</u> by Kim Parker From talented textile designer Kim Parker comes a gorgeous counting book in which readers can count from one to ten while they search among the colorful flowers for various creatures hidden among lush garden scenes. Ages 3-5

<u>Tarra & Bella: The Elephant and Dog Who Became Best Friends</u> by Carol Buckley Best friends come in all shapes and sizes! After retiring from the circus, Tarra became the first resident of the Elephant Sanctuary in Tennessee. When other elephants moved in and developed close friendships, only Tarra remained independent until the day she met a stray mixed-breed dog named Bella. Ages 3-5

<u>The Big Snow</u> by **Berta Hader**, **Elmer Hader** When the geese begin to fly south, the leaves flutter down from the trees and the cold winds begin to blow from the north, the animals of the woods and meadows, big and small, prepare for the long, cold winter ahead when the countryside is hidden under a deep blanket of snow. Ages 6-9

My First Coding Book by <u>Kiki Prottsman</u> Teach kids as young as 5 years old the basic programming skills necessary to code, including sequencing and loops, without a computer. Grade K-2

On a Beam of Light: A Story of Albert Einstein by Jennifer Berne Travel along with Einstein on a journey full of curiosity, laughter, and scientific discovery. Grades K-3

<u>Bee Dance</u> by **Rick Chrustowski** A honeybee searches for nectar, then returns to the hive to tell the other bees. She does a waggle dance, moving in a special figure-eight pattern to share the location of the food source with her hive mates. DRA 14

<u>Thunder on the Plains: The Story of the American Buffalo</u> by **Ken Robbins** Ken Robbins tells in words and historical photographs the amazing yet tragic story of a magnificent and truly American creature: the buffalo. Grades 2-5

<u>A Lesson for Martin Luther King Jr.</u> by <u>Denise Lewis Patrick</u> Young Martin Luther King Jr. is having some problems with his best friend, Bobby. First, they are going to different schools this year. Next, Bobby's dad is not letting his son play with Martin. When Martin learns why, he is confused and hurt -- but he learns a lesson that he will never forget. Grade 2

A Boy Named Boomer by Boomer Esiason American football player. Grade 2

<u>Molly, By Golly!</u> By **Dianne Ochiltree** This legendary tale introduces young readers to Molly Williams, an African American cook for New York City's Fire Company 11, who is considered to be the first known female firefighter in U.S. history. DRA 20

<u>Buffalo Bill</u> by <u>Ingri d'Aulaire</u>, Presents Buffalo Bill s time in American history, from buffalo stampedes and Indian attacks to the Pony Express and Wild West shows.

<u>Betsy Ross</u> by: <u>Becky White</u> "Betsy ripped. Rip, rip. / Seven rich, crimson strips." Delightful rhymes, rhythms, and repetition describe the creation of the first American flag by Betsy Ross and her friend, George Washington. Grades K-5 DRA I

My Dream of Martin Luther King by: Faith Ringgold Martin Luther King, Jr.'s life — from dealing with segregation in childhood to the Montgomery bus boycott, the March on Washington, his epic "I Have a Dream" speech, and his tragic assassination. Grades K-5 DRA M

<u>Let's Read About: Cesar Chavez</u> by Jerry Tello A profile of César Chávez, the Mexican American union leader who fought to get migrant farm workers better wages. DRA 14

# **Graphic Novels**

<u>Dragon Girl: The Secret Valley</u> by **Jeff Weigel** Alanna discovers a nest of dragon eggs and decides to raise them herself, but is soon caught up in a conflict between knights and dragons. Grades 2-6

<u>Little Robot</u> by **Ben Hatke** When a little girl finds an adorable robot in the woods, she presses a button and accidentally activates him for the first time. Now, she finally has a friend. Ages 6-9

<u>Where's Leopold? Your Pajamas are Showing!</u> by Michel-Yves Schmitt Leopold wakes up one morning invisible. Unfortunately, his clothing is not! First of the "Where's Leopold?" Grade 2-4
